




Do you think the legalization of marijuana in the Marianas will reduce violence, car accidents, and decrease the use of other drugs?



Do you or anyone you know grow marijuana?





SURVEY FINDINGS

Many of the responders did not have relatives that use marijuana medicinally. The majority of 56% have not consumed marijuana in any type of way. Regarding whether marijuana was dangerous or safe, the survey takers voted 40% for dangerous and safe. Also, 40% of the survey takers voted that they do not think that the legalization of marijuana in the Marianas will reduce violence, car accidents, and decrease the use of other drugs. It was unpredictable to state whether it was safe or not, and if it will reduce violence, car accidents, and the use of other drugs because legalization was not fully enacted in the Marianas. Many of the responders have the knowledge to grow marijuana which was beneficial to them and the majority of them also think that marijuana was a negative and positive impact in the life of others in which it can be both depending on their health condition and amount of consumption.

How does the use of marijuana help your financially?

- → Yes, marijuana is cheaper than medicine especially because I do not have insurance.
- 2. Is the use of marijuana more affordable than the medication prescribed by the doctor?
 - → Yes, I grow my plants which do not cost me anything but the amount of prescribed medication is too much, I

can not afford it. My marijuana supply lasts long enough until my next harvest.

- 3. How do you feel towards the change of using marijuana medicinally?
 - → Using marijuana as my medicine made me feel more relieved and health because I know that it does not contain chemicals like other medicines.

*INTERVIEW FINDINGS

- During the interview with the patient who uses marijuana medicinally, she stated that marijuana helps her financially,
- makes her relieved, and feels that it was safer than the medication prescribed from the pharmacy. She mentioned that she
- grows her plants to save money from buying it. The maintenance of growing a marijuana plant would take time, but if a
- person wanted chronic plants then one must put effort and time into taking care of their plant. Growing a plant does not cost
- a person much compared to the medications that costs more than \$20 depending on the prescription. Furthermore, she felt
- relieved and content when she stopped taking prescription medication and started using marijuana. She believed that
- prescription medicines contain chemicals that affects your body to react to it, depending on your health condition, and it could cost more damage to one's health especially if they have various health issues.

LITERATURE REVIEW FINDINGS 😒

As of October 16, 2019, the search of marijuana resulted of 64,000,000, on Google. On Google Scholar, about 666,000, results appeared with the search of marijuana. The articles from Google web were non-academic resources. The Google Scholar articles were academic resources that were peer-reviewed and had conducted studies regarding marijuana. Aside from these resources, the local news articles of marijuana were on Saipan Tribune and Marianas Variety. The bill was provided online and anyone was allowed to access this file. This literature review will discuss the various non-academic and academic resources relating to marijuana providing information from the Commonwealth Cannabis Act, Saipan Tribune, Marianas Variety, and academic resources.

Igisomar bagarts anew for responsible use of marijuana stated that Senator Sixto pushed to legalize marijuana in the Marianas for patients who were deeply in need of this medication. Sixto stated that boiling the leaves, roots, or any part of the herb could be consumed as a tea. This would treat those with chronic diseases or epilepsy. In another article called *Marijuana bill passes house*, it stated that Senator Sixto Igisomar was the first to introduce this bill. Even more, this bill was called Taulumwaar Sensible CNMI Cannabis Act of 2018, which was named after the late David K. Peter.

Public Law 20-66 (CNMI Cannabis Act of 2018), as of September 21, 2019, the CNMI governor Ralph Deleon Guerrero signed the

Taulumwaar Sensible CNMI Cannabis Act of 2018 that legalized marijuana in the Marianas for recreational, medicinal, and commercial use.

and penalties to specific violations. There were about 7 types of licenses which included: production, processor, wholesale, retail, lounge,

testing facility, and delivery. To each license, there were limitations in regards to the number of marijuana products, form of cannabis

products, age, and purpose. If any of these licenses were to be violated, there are penalties. The penalties depend on the violation and the degree of violation.

Economic Effects of National Marijuana Legalization was a document that stated the history of marijuana in America, taxes, criminal action cost, medicinal effects, medicinal versus recreational marijuana, effects of financial markets, and banking institutions. This document was useful for the student researcher because it can be a comparison to how America and the Marianas handled marijuana in terms of taxes, banking, effects, and history. The student researcher gained information on how other states handle this situation and why it was handled that
